On 7th March 2025, KC Group of Research and Professional Institutes marked International Women's Day with a simple yet heartfelt event dedicated solely to our female faculty members. No external speakers were invited; instead, students and staff focused on appreciating teachers through a small gift ceremony and light interactive activities.

**Activities Conducted:**

- **Opening Remarks:** The Women's Cell Coordinator welcomed all attendees and briefly reflected on the importance of recognizing women's contributions in education.
- **Gift Distribution:** Each woman teacher was called on stage to receive:
  - A fresh flower bouquet
  - A personalized "Thank You" card signed by her students
  - A modest gift voucher for books or stationeryAs each teacher accepted her gifts, applause filled the hall and students took quick photographs on stage.
- **Interactive Game ("Pass the Flower"):** While a piece of music played, an artificial flower was passed among teachers. When the music stopped, the teacher holding the flower shared a short memory or lesson from her career. This generated laughter and light anecdotes.
- **Women's Day Trivia:** Teachers formed two mixed teams and answered five short questions about notable women in various fields. Correct responses earned small token prizes (decorated bookmarks).
- **Refreshments & Informal Mingling:** After activities, light snacks (mini sandwiches, cookies) and tea/coffee were served. Faculty and students used this time to interact casually, exchange warm wishes, and enjoy a relaxed atmosphere.
- **Closing Remarks:** The Head of Department thanked the organizing committee and highlighted how small gestures like these foster camaraderie and motivate teachers for the semester ahead.
